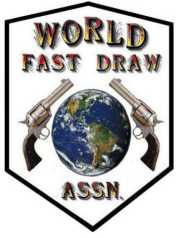
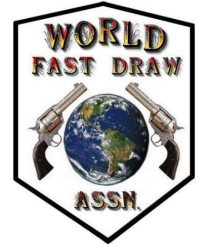

Perhaps Dean can work on that issue for next year. Sat the wind blew something fierce and had Trickshot shooting balloons out of the air. Sat night it snowed. Sunday morning was windy & very cold. Fortunately for all of us Dean has an indoor range that came in mighty handy Sunday.

There was a great turnout for the first Chairman contest of the year with Modified Division having eight competitors in Women's and 35 competitors in Men's. The Canadians showed up in full force as did the Oregon shooters. Hollywood Division (now "Thumbing Division") had 26 competitors. Wow, Some of those folks can rip it.

I think several of us expected to see many records broken at this shoot but it did not happen. I think it was mainly due to the weather (Dean's fault). Howard Darby did break the record for 5' Standing Wax Series with a 1.186 which was previously held by Jon Rivera with a 1.187. For Thumbing Juliana Bateman, fifteen years old (I think) established the Women's records for S/B/W with a 3.837 and for D/B 4" @ 8' with a 1.876.

I want to thank Dean Cummins & family for hosting, cooking, & all the other services they provided. Thanks also to John Arnold, Brian Colwell, Bob Nielson, and all the other volunteers that helped out at the contest. Thanks to all the score keepers and timer operators. Everyone really pitched in and helped at this contest. It was great.

In my opinion we had a good Board Meeting which included a wide range of subjects. Thanks VERY MUCH to Diana Rosen for writing down the minutes of the meeting. Our Secretary could not make the meeting due to obligations at school with her students.

Big thank you to John Arnold for donating the prizes for the 50/50 drawing to raise \$\$ to promote the WFDA.

Bob Neilson won the 50/50 drawing and donated his half back to the WFDA. Way to go Bob. Several members purchased caps, patches, and shirts at the contest, which of course helps the WFDA budget.

All members, regardless of country are encouraged to join the NRA. You can do it through our Treasurer, Miles Miller, and the WFDA gets a percentage of it. Also if we get a high enough percentage of members in NRA, it will make WFDA eligible for grants.

I find it very enjoyable to watch our youngsters grow up in this sport. In Watkins I walked up to Connor who is near as tall as I am, and I said "hi Conner". From what sounded like the bottom of a deep well came this very, very low voice "hi how you doing". I had to do a double take to make sure that it was Connor, who is a very nice young man & future World Champ.

Competitions like Watkins and the people we have in the WFDA make me proud to be a small part of the World Fast Draw Assoc.

April 25, 2014

The meeting of the Board of the WFDA was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in Watkins Colorado on April 25, 2014.

Dan Qualls, Chairman, read the minutes of the last meeting and they were approved.

The issue of hand judging was raised at the shooters meeting. Dan explained that it is the job of the hand judge to call light jumping by the shooter, or if the left hand touches the shooter's gun before the light goes off, or if there is a flash on the target due to reflecting light from a watch or other item. He reminded everyone that hand judges need to be aware of what goes on with the shooter they are judging. He also asked that everyone take off any watch or item they wear that might reflect on the targets.

Treasurer Miles Miller reported that we are doing pretty well. Members paying for insurance through Pay Pal works well and Pay Pal also works well for membership payments. He expressed appreciation to Howard Darby for suggesting this and for setting it up. He also reported that we have about \$15,000 after paying for last year's buckles and insurance.

Dan Qualls announced that he has WFDA patches and polo shirts for sale as a fund raiser for WFDA. He is also working on having a copy of the WFDA emblem made up that shooters can put on their favorite shooting shirts.

Dan Qualls put a proposal before the group to change the name of the Hollywood Division to the Thumbing Division. Dan said it would be a clearer description of the division and make it easier for new members or interested people to figure out what it was all about.

Frank Lawton spoke about how Hollywood Division was suggested by him to increase membership by encouraging new shooters to join and former members to come back. Frank said he understands why the name change has been suggested. He liked Jim Tinsley's suggestion of calling it Hollywood/Thumbing.

Richard Parmentier said he thinks we should have a rewrite by the rules committee.

Dan Qualls said he was proposing ONLY a name change, not a rule change. He clarified that rule changes need to be submitted early enough to publish in the Top Gun Magazine 30 days before any meeting at which they could be voted on. Jon Wilson asked when the name change would go into effect if the proposal passed. Dan Qualls said it would go into effect immediately if it was approved.

Gregg Townsley spoke in favor of the name change. He mentioned he had enjoyed shooting CFDA until so many rules were added. He went to WFDA and liked it better. Gregg said that the name change was a good way to involve new people. He liked it and saw it as a "big umbrella" under which more people could join.

Brian Colwell asked if there would be a separate set of records just for Thumbing Division. Dan Qualls said there would be. Jon Wilson asked if a record was set in Hollywood would it stand until broken in the newly designated Thumbing Division. Dan Qualls said it would. He clarified that he was only proposing a name change for the division, not a rule change or a new set of records.

Dan Qualls called for a vote on the proposed name change and the following board members voted yes:

Jim Tinsley, Jon Wilson (representing Dale Weitzel) , Colby Qualls(represented by Dan Qualls), Gregg Townsley, Larry Schipper, Frank Lawton, Gary Rosen, John Arnold, Dennis Robinson, Miles Miller, Ruth Ann Qualls(secretary, represented by Dan Qualls). The proposal passed unanimously and was immediately effective.

Frank Lawton thanked Dan Qualls for doing a lot of exhaustive research of the records to find and record the records for the Thumbing Division.

Dan Qualls thanked Frank Lawton for starting the division and helping to increase the membership. Joe Colwell reminded us that all shooters need to load and unload with their guns pointed at the targets and not at other shooters or any other persons.

Dan Qualls brought up a request from Nick Quick to approve his plan to paint the WFDA emblem on his new truck. It was stated that any member in good standing could use the emblem, but Dan explained Nick wanted to know if anyone in the membership objected. No one objected. Frank Lawton suggested that we copyright the WFDA logo to prevent any unauthorized use. Mike Pantano suggested checking with Dave Livingston. Frank Lawton shared his experience of copyrighting the logo for his Mustang Rally group to prevent unauthorized use.

A suggestion was made to put our logo into some gun related magazines. The question of cost arose and Frank Lawton said because of our status as a 501 organization it would only cost about \$500 for a small ad in most magazines. Brian Colwell thought it was a good idea to use money from the 50/50 raffle to place an ad to promote WFDA. He said we should decide if we really wanted to grow the sport or just keep it a hobby. Frank Lawton said we need to advertise, but also to think outside the box to grow the sport of Fastdraw. Nick Quick said we need to get our information out into the public to those who don't know about the sport. Jon Wilson mentioned the magazine Cowboy Chronicle as a possible magazine for advertising. Gregg Townsley said we need a campaign strategy for ads and promotion not just putting stuff into the SASS magazine which is going out on computer only in the near future.

Dan Qualls brought up for review a discussion about Bob Graham. He had received email from a guy with a user name of BAM regarding a purchase from Bob Graham. Apparently he had found an ad from Bob Graham on a website and was not happy with the product he purchased and not happy with Bob Graham's refusal to refund his purchase price. This unhappy client suggested strongly that the WFDA distance themselves from Bob Graham and not post any ads from him. Dan recommended the same. He said Mr. Graham is not a current active member and not paying any fees. Larry Shipper suggested that we have a disclaimer that we do not endorse our advertisers.

A question was asked regarding if anyone had any possible advertisers for our Top gun Magazine. Gregg Townsley asked what was the cost. Gregg volunteered after someone suggested it, to pursue advertising for our Top Gun magazine (self titled Advertising Wazeer).

Gary Rosen mentioned how our membership had grown by encouraging former CFDA shooters to join our ranks. He mentioned Dean Cummings group and the shooters from Oregon. Gary wanted to pursue connecting with Chad Briely (Lighting Jesse) in Texas. Gary mentioned Chad has many shooters in his club and many willing to shoot WFDA. He also said Chad's range is an excellent place to host a WFDA shoot. Former attempts to work with Chad had failed for a number of reasons. Dan Qualls mentioned Chad did not return his emails. Jim Tinsley mentioned some

confusion about financial sponsorship. Gregg Townsley mentioned some pushback from CFDA regarding their members shooting at WFDA shoots. Brian Colwell said Chad wants to be part of WFDA. Gary voiced his opinion that extending a hand to Chad could greatly increase our membership and the board asked Gary to connect with Chad and find out what Chad would need to work with WFDA.

A question arose regarding how to fit a new competition into our busy WFDA schedule. Brian Colwell explained that cutting an established competition out for just one year would cause a loss of any sponsorship which would be difficult to replace. Gregg Townsley said he believed starting new clubs was the way to increase membership. Dean Cummings said the only complaint his CFDA shooters had was they wanted to shoot more often. Having monthly shoots at the club level created a willingness to pay for membership.

Larry Schipper moved that the meeting be adjourned. Jon Wilson and Jim Tinsley seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned.

#### **GROWING THE SPORT OF FAST DRAW**

With the contest season upon us, I want to express my deep appreciation to those folks in Area 6 — Oregon, Washington, Idaho — who are making an effort at growing the sport of Fast Draw in the northwest by attending a WFDA-sanctioned contest. All of them are members of the new Portland Fast Draw Club in St. Helens, Oregon.

Take Scott Bateman, for instance, and his daughter Juliana, who despite her young age is beginning to build a well-deserved reputation. The Batemans are hoping to build a Fast Draw club in Dayton, Oregon after the 2014 Oregon Six Gun World Championship in August.

Or Howard Baker and Bob McKee, who attended their first chairman's contest in April. Howard and Bob are accomplished shootists — Howard is the main wheel to Oregon's Timber Beasts BB Gun Shooting Team if you haven't heard (they travel nationally). Both men look forward to starting their own club in Hillsboro, Oregon. Bob won a special "sportsmanship" trophy in Watkins.

Also a participant at the Watkins, Colorado contest, Shawn Anderson and I spoke about starting a WFDA-oriented Fast Draw club in the Oregon town of Sweet Home as well.

As I said at our annual meeting in Watkins, these vice-chairmen and chairmen-sanctioned events don't build the sport of Fast Draw, people do. And while they're fun — I'll make at least two chairmen-sanctioned contests this year, despite holding down two jobs and writing the W. W. Ronin series of Westerns available on Amazon — it's the local contests and clubs that matter most. It's exciting to me to see so much going on in Oregon. And while the first Fast Draw club in Washington was just recently started by another Fast Draw association, I'm happy for that too. Because the more there are of us, the stronger our sport(s) become.

#### **THE FIRST OREGON SIX GUN WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP, AUGUST 23-24, 2014**

Sure, there have been Oregon Fast Draw contests before. The northwest has hosted some of the finest shooters in Fast Draw over the years. But when the sport declined, northwest shooters found other things to do until Oregon Fast Draw, LLC began to build Fast Draw clubs beginning in 2008.

Area 6's first chairman-sanctioned contest in some time, the Oregon Six Gun World Championship is shaping up to be a first-class event. If you don't know, the words "World Championship" means there will be at least \$5,000 on the table. And other than a special contribution that raised the men's top prize to \$1,000, the prizes are deliberately large and equal. A hand-engraved handgun will be raffled off. (Your entry guarantees you a ticket. Others will be sold.) A holster rig will be given away. Records will be set. And a special jack-pot shoot on Friday night will award some additional money. WFDA membership is required for both contests—the "Open" division and the newly renamed "Hollywood" or "Thumbing" division.

The city of Dayton is going all out for this event with a concert stage and band, vendors and local merchants offering special "western days" discounts.

We're most appreciative of the WFDA help we've been given to do this as well — Larry Shipper (Nevada) for instance, who has promised to help keep things in good order, and Brian Colwell (Colorado) who has volunteered to help call the match. Aside from cash and prize considerations, Scott Bateman (971.275.3835) is ramrodding the event. He'll be happy to connect shooters with hotels (Red Lion, Quality Inn and an Oregon experience, the McMenamins Hotel), which are all within 5 miles of the Dayton city park where we'll be shooting. An RV park with full hook-ups is even closer.

## **IMPORTANT REGARDING THE CANADIAN CONTEST**

For participants (residents and non-residents) who possess a valid Possession and Acquisition Licence (PAL) or Possession Only Licence (POL).

- 1.) The full name and date of birth of the participant;
- 2.) The participant's firearms license number;
- 3.) The firearm registration certificate for each restricted firearm and/or, if applicable, prohibited 12(6) handgun;
- 4.) E-mail address of the participant;
- 5.) Transport dates to and from their residence to the event.
- 6.) A duly completed Authorization to Transport application (RCMP 679). This form will capture most of the information above.

For participants who are non-residents and do not have a valid Possession and Acquisition License (PAL).

- 1.) The full name and date of birth of the participant;
- 2.) The participant must complete the attached document labelled as "CFO BC & YT - Non-Resident Authorization to Transport" and submit it directly to the office of the Chief Firearms Officer for BC & YT. In addition, the non-resident must complete RCMP forms 5589 and 5590 (if applicable), and submit it to the Canada Border Service Officer when they enter Canada with their firearms. Non-residents are not entitled to bring into Canada any firearms or devices that are classified as prohibited in Canada.
- 3.) The complete physical address of the place (hotel, residence, etc) where they will be staying while in British Columbia for this event.
- 4.) E-mail address of the participant.

Due to the high number of participants, it might be best if you could compile a list of all confirmed participants and routinely update me as new participants are confirmed. Our office will be referring to the list you provide to prior to the issuance of any ATT and letter. If we receive any applications from individual who is not on the list you provide, then we will not action their request.

**Someone pointed out to me that most of this section of rules did not get pasted into the new 2011 rule book. I think all the experienced shooters know this but it may be helpful for new shooters to read before practicing for a contest. You may want to cut (with scissors) and tape into your rule book.**

## **2011 PART IV COMPETITION RULES**

### **A. GENERAL**

1. Prior to receiving the signal to draw, the contestant's hands shall be placed in the following manner.
  - a. The gun hand may be on or touching the gun. The trigger finger shall not enter the trigger guard.
  - b. The fanning hand shall not purposely come into contact with the gun, holster, belt, or any part of the rig prior to the start signal. Nor shall the fanning hand come into contact with the body, the other hand, or used as a pivot point about which to make the draw.
  - c. It must be reasonably evident to the Line Judge that the shooter is not touching the gun with the fanning hand. Penalty: First violation, warning. Second violation will result in the loss of that shot. Only one warning will be given for each event.
  - d. After the shooter commands have been given, the contestant shall not be falling back and become off balance, if it is obvious to the officials that he/she is using this method consistently to anticipate the light he/she will be first warned and then the second time will be a loss of shot.
  - e. Prior to shooting and setting gun in holster and the signal "Ready Set command" given, the hammer must be in the fully down position to begin the draw.

All ACQDA, WFDA and CFDA safety rules will be followed for each respective event.

All shooters will shoot in all five events, ACQDA, Bounty Hunters Poker, CFDA, WFDA Doubles and WFDA Step-back. WFDA members will also be competing for cash prizes and points in the two WFDA events.

ACQDA (American Cowboy Quick Draw): .45 LC, Five foot, cowboy shape target with light in center of chest at 21' from shooter. Shoot till you hit or until you open the loading gate. No fanning allowed, women/youth may use two hands after 1st shot. Men must take all shots with one hand. Shooters are paired by random draw of each round. Target is not greased.

WFDA (World Fast Draw Association), Hollywood-style Step-back, index: .45LC, Rectangular target (40" x 20" with the top 64" off the ground) with light at center of the target. One light, one shot per distance. Distances 5', 8', 10', 12', 15'. Targets will be coated with white lithium grease.

Hollywood-style Doubles, index: .45LC. Rectangular target. Right hand shooters shoot left to right and vice versa for left hand shooters. Only 2 shots are taken and a miss is given 1.000 second penalty. You must thumb the first shot, second shot may be fanned.

Bounty Hunters - Poker, index: .22LR black powder blank. Approx. 5" Balloon targets (one on the left, one on the right) at 8'. Sitting at table located in between lights, holding "Deadman's Hand" above the level of a soda can, pistol is staged on table. Once the light comes on, drop the cards and shoot the balloon. Pistol and ammo provided by host.

CFDA (Cowboy Fast Draw): .45LC, Round 24" target with light at 50" off the ground at 15' from shooter. One light, one shot. Fanning allowed if fanning hand is visible at the side of the body prior to light coming on. Target will be coated with white lithium grease. Shooters are paired at random draw for first round and 2nd round losers of the first round are drawn against each other followed by the winners of the first round.

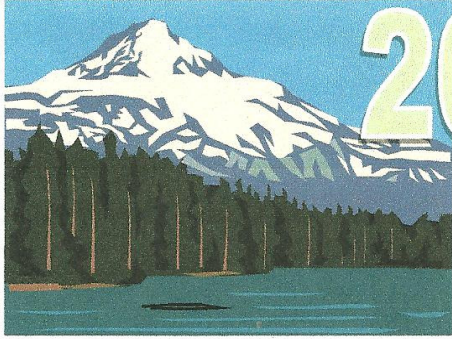
You must provide your own .45LC pistol and cases. Wax and primers will be provided by the host. Any stock pistol or holster acceptable per ACQDA rules will be allowed in all events shooting wax. Other than the WFDA events for WFDA members where all WFDA rules will apply.

The two WFDA index shoots will be Vice Chair sanctioned and require WFDA membership for points. All shooter will shoot this style, but only members will get points. There will be an additional \$20 fee and prize structure (75% of fee paid back to top 3 places) for those members. All WFDA rules will apply to both of these events. Discounted memberships will be available to those interested.

Each contest will be given a point value based on the number of shooters. For example, if there are 12 men shooting the top place in each contest will get 12 points until finally 12th place would get one point. So there would be a possible 60 points for all five contests combined. Team Showdown and the Charity Shoot do not count in the overall contest. Ties will be broken by the ACQDA 2/3, double elimination contest.

All shooters comfortable with the position may be asked to assist the host as an announcer/timer, score keeper or range officer.

Good sportsmanship is not only appreciated but expected. As not many have shot all the different types of fast draw, help your fellow competitor, we are here to have fun!!!!

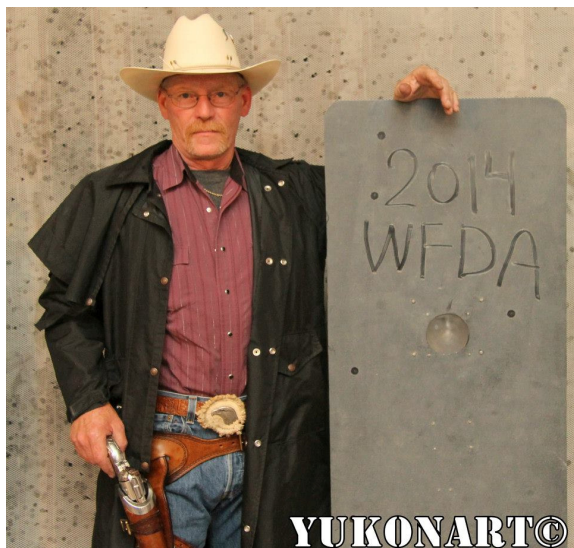
